

Job two: Radio

A. Radio hosts responsibilities are to provide an on-air personality while announcing or playing music also to provide commentary and interview guests for entertainment.

Not all radio hosts have a degree for it but many employers prefer one the course needed is the degree in Communication and Broadcasting which they will take for a length of 1-3 years after completing the course they must gain several years in work experience before even starting for real. Many key skill radio hosts need are a strong voice, positive personality, efficient multi-tasking and people skills.

Many challenges radio hosts face are they need to always be creative and quick on their feet generating ideas for live material and entertainment for the audience. Also many industries have already hired or are looking for high quality employees with experience in the field before an interview is even able. Some have to work increasingly long hours and might have to be an on-call worker or non-traditional shifts.

Most radio host start off as student hosting at their school having a passion for the subject they seek it during higher education and almost always start at entry level before gaining work experience and many different course to do with it before advancing up the ranks.

A famous radio host is Lynn Parsons born in 1964 and graduating college with an OND in electronic principles, she started off her career working in the television industry after she moved through many famous radio stations such as JFM, Saturday night music, the more popular radio stations were in 1987 where she joined London's Capital FM as a weeknight presenter before moving to Radio 2 in 1991 and also having work for Radio 2, Virgin Radio.
